# Project Background

## The Issues:

- Duplicative efforts happening throughout the state
- Inconsistent messaging
- Education Campaigns focused on providing information, rather than encouraging behavior change
- High costs associated with material development
- No central “hub” of information

## STEP SIX: SELECT MESSAGING

\*Messaging will be developed after the stakeholder feedback has been collected and the final topics/audiences have been decided.

Save Money Now! Septic repairs and replacements can be expensive. Take advantage of the city's rebate program and connect to central sewer today.

Your springs need you. Connect to the city's new central sewer system and protect our natural resources for future generations.



Septic Systems are old and outdated. Be cool. Connect to Sewer.

## STEP SEVEN: SELECT ADDITIONAL MESSAGING

\*Some materials may have multiple areas for messaging, titles, pictures, etc. This is just an simplified example.

Materials with multiple text boxes may have text options that are grouped together, so steps five and six would be combined.

### Select Additional Messaging:

#### Did you Know?

- Traditional septic systems are not designed to treat nutrient pollution
- Nutrient pollution is one of the biggest threats to Florida's water quality
- Other Good information about Septic Systems protecting the environment



#### Did you Know?

- On average, homeowners spend \$\*\*\* a year on septic maintenance
- Repairing a failing drain field can cost between \$\*\*\* and \$\*\*\*
- Switching to central sewer can save you \$\*\*\* over \*\*\* years

# Nonpoint Publication Tool: Frequently Asked Questions

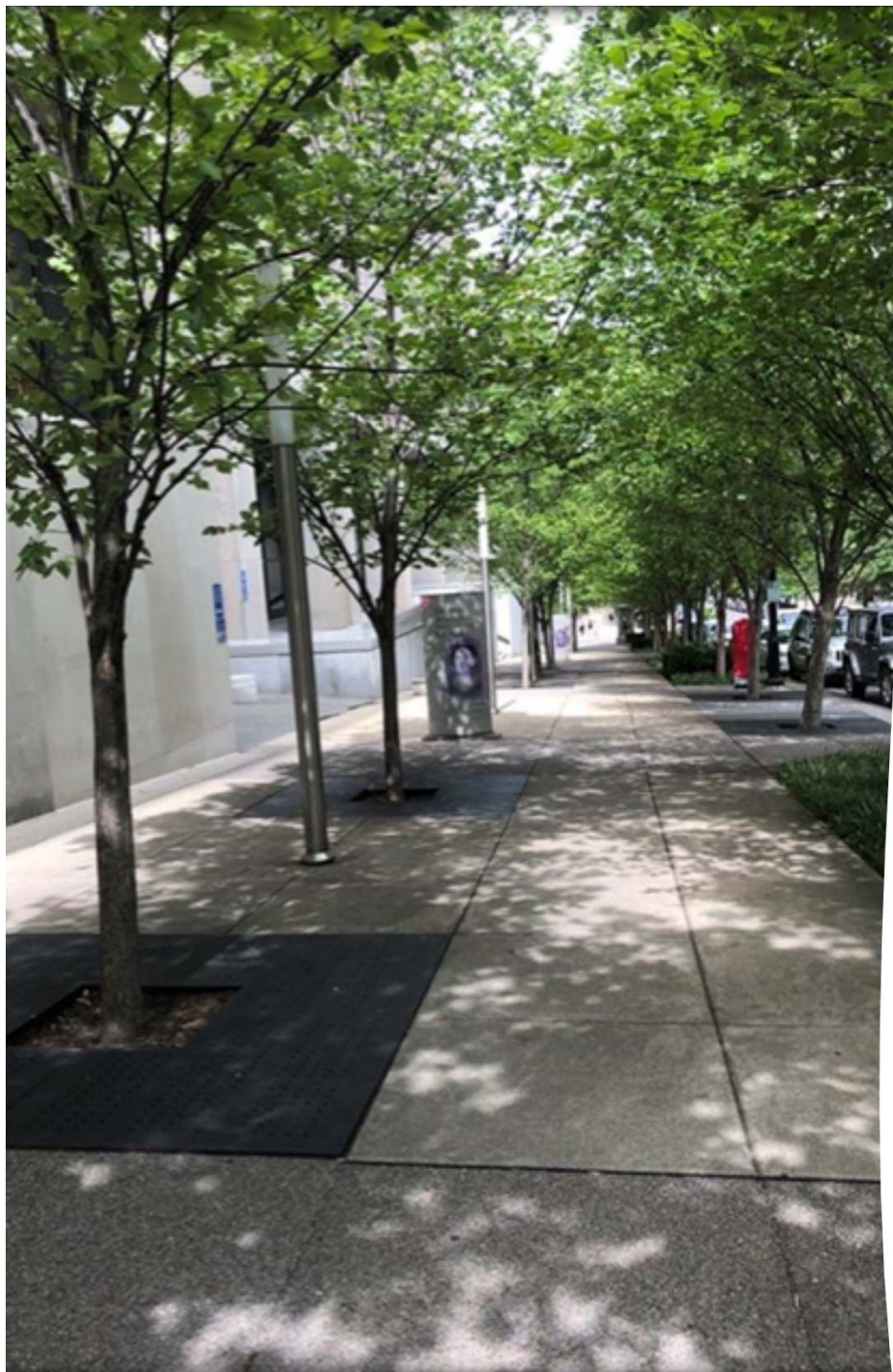
- **When will the project be finished?**
